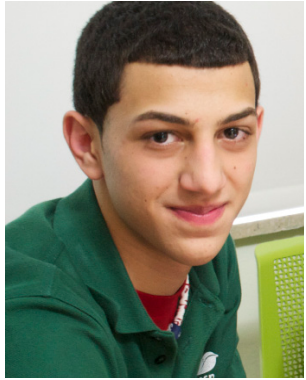

How is our academic program different?

- Our curriculum is developed around the prestigious and academically challenging International Baccalaureate program, and enriched by a global focus and emphasis on critical thinking, effective communication, and collaboration.
- Students engage in an inquiry-based program that is designed to nurture curiosity and foster development of the whole child.
- Our small size (approximately 11:1 student to teacher ratio) allows us to support each of our students who range from advanced learners to students with an IEP.



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What is the International Baccalaureate Program?

Academically challenging and balanced, the International Baccalaureate Program prepares students for success in academia, college, and beyond. This world class program emphasizes interdisciplinary work and study of a second language, and encourages deep learning that incorporates global trends. The program has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities. Many colleges, including the University of Pennsylvania and Columbia University, offer credits for high school IB coursework. Others, such as Harvard University, offer second-year status upon admission to students with an IB diploma and the opportunity to place into higher-level courses. Some colleges even offer early admission to students with an IB Diploma.
